
DOCK AND MOORING REGULATIONS

Docks and Moorings

The Club maintains two moorings in Stage Harbor for Club members and visiting guests. Each is attached to a 4,000 pound block. The fee schedule is available from the Dock and Mooring Committee.

The rules governing use of the moorings are:

1. All requests must be made in advance to a member of the Dock and Mooring Committee for a specific period, not to exceed fourteen (14) days.
2. If an extension of time is desired, the Dock and Mooring Committee must be notified in advance and may approve a continuation if possible.

Dinghy Dock Regulations

A floating dock is maintained by the Club for the convenience of members and visiting guests. It is located adjacent to the Stage Harbor Marine launch dock and is to be used for securing small boats used only as tenders.

All boats must be registered; the current annual fee is \$25.00, payable in advance. Boats must have affixed, on the inside transom, the “MYC Dinghy Dock Registration” sticker showing registration number, owner’s name and telephone number. Stickers, with the Club burgee, are available from the Dock and Mooring Committee.

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1. Inflatable boats are not to exceed 10 feet in length. Hard-sided boats (plastic, wood or metal) are not to exceed 8 feet in length.
 2. Dinghies are for use as tenders only for members' boats moored in the Stage Harbor Complex (Oyster Pond & River, Mitchell River and Mill Pond).
 3. No sailboards, personal water craft, runabouts or anything other than the above will be tied to the Dinghy Dock at any time.
 4. Only one dinghy per member at any one time. Members may not use other members' names to register more than one dinghy.
 5. No commercial enterprises of any kind will be conducted utilizing the MYC Dinghy Dock.
 6. Yearly stickers are for members only.
 7. Visiting boats: Yachtsmen from reciprocal clubs as identified in the Register of American Yachts Clubs may use the MYC Dinghy Dock with permission from a member of the Dock and Mooring Committee for up to 24 hours, with appropriate identification.
 8. Visiting boats using the MYC moorings will be provided special identification and be allowed to use the MYC Dinghy Dock during their stay.
 9. Any craft not properly identified will be *REMOVED AND SECURED WITH STAGE HARBOR MARINE OR THE CHATHAM HARBORMASTER. THE OWNER WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY FEES.*
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10. The owner of any craft identified as a member's and without proper identification or valid sticker will be notified. Twenty-four (24) hours after notification, the member will be fined ten dollars a week until the boat is removed or the fine is paid and the proper sticker is obtained.
11. Any unpaid fines will be added to the member's dues for the following year.
12. Any member, upon being contacted by the Dock and Mooring Committee, Club Officer or Board Member regarding violations of the Dinghy Dock Regulations, who refuses to remedy the violation, will be subject to removal from the Club at the discretion of the Board of Governors.
13. Imposition of fines or punitive actions are subject to appeal to the Dock and Mooring Committee and then to the Board of Governors.
